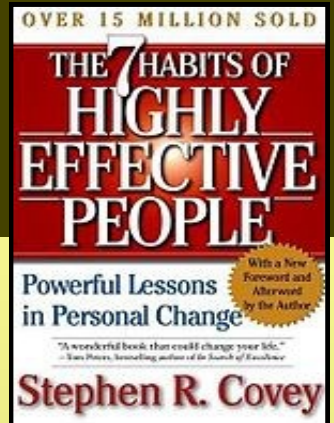

Art became a certified 7 Habits instructor in 2005. He also has taught the tenets of the 7 Habits to Business and Industry and to UW-Extension colleagues at state conferences and meetings.

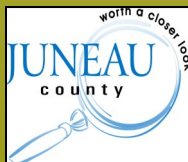
