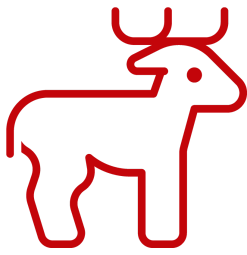
Houseplant Care Resources
